HYDRANT FLUSHING BHV staff conducts flushing on the **Tuesday before the first Friday of every month between the hours of 9am-4pm**. BHV staff will conduct flushing on Tuesday October 3. Water discoloration is one of the most common consequences of flushing, as minerals in the water main stir up while they are flushed out. **In the event of discolored water, turn on a hose or faucet for 5 – 15 minutes to clear out your waterline**. If your water does not clear up, or it's discolored on a date not around the normal flushing period, please contact the Deputy Clerk.

FINAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION BHV collects household hazardous waste (HHW--fertilizer, cleaning products, paint, etc.) on the first Monday trash collection day of each month, April – November, and takes these items directly to the Washtenaw County Home Toxins Collection Center. The final days for hazardous waste collection are October 2 and November 6.

HHW items put out with the trash after November will not be picked up, and may <u>NOT</u> be brought to the maintenance area, as there is no safe place to store the items. Please visit https://www.washtenaw.org/287/Household-Hazardous-Waste-Disposal for information on dropping off household hazardous waste at a HHW facility.

<u>CLIMATE CORNER</u> Climate change and climate disaster are real. How can we prepare? Climate Resilience means "the ability to prepare and plan for, absorb, recover from, and more successfully adapt to adverse events."

What is the Village doing to promote Climate Resilience?

- Employee houses are being updated (from pre WWII conditions) with more insulation and new windows. Old oil furnaces are being replaced with high-efficiency gas furnaces and high-efficiency heat pumps.
- The water tower is being updated with a new generator to ensure a continuous water supply in a power outage.
- Tree clearing near power lines.
- A lecture series, "Do you have a plan?" will begin in October providing information on steps to climate disaster preparedness.

<u>ALERT - OAK WILT</u> Oak Wilt has been identified in Bird Park directly across Barton Pond from the Village. The Ann Arbor Forester has not discovered additional areas of infestation. He has recommended for further information, the website https://www.michiganoakwilt.org/oak-wilt-101. Oak Wilt primarily infects red oak trees. White oak trees are resistant, but not immune.






Figure 1 Figure 2

Quick Guide - red oak trees have pointy leaves and white oak trees rounded leaves (Figure 1). The first sign is when the leaves turn yellow, or brown accompanied by a rapid leaf drop (Figure 2). Death of the tree occurs within 3 – 6 months. The fungus spreads through the tree's root system. Efforts should be made to control the spread of the fungus. Do not prune infected oaks between April 15 and July 15. Do not move firewood: oak wilt is broadly spread by the movement of infected wood. Please notify the Village office if you think your trees may be infected.

<u>**DEER ALERT!**</u> Lyme disease is spread by the deer tick. We have had four Village residents with Lyme disease. In Washtenaw County, the incidence of Lyme disease tripled between 2020 and 2021, and in 2022 reached a 10-year high. Lyme disease can also infect household pets who are allowed outside. If you walk in the woods, underbrush, or your yard be sure and check for ticks when you return home.

Watch out for Deer! They are more active in September/October and are likely to be crossing our roads. Last year, Michigan experienced 58,000 deer/auto collisions.
