<u>PUBLIC SAFETY, EMS, AND SECURITY</u> Call 911 for EMS, a crime, fire, suspicious car/vehicle, road safety violations, or alarms. The Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department provides public safety services, and the Ann Arbor Township Fire Department addresses

medical and fire emergencies. For non-emergency issues, you can contact the Sheriff at (734) 971-8400, and the Fire Department at (734) 741-5900.

<u>VILLAGE-CENTRIC EMERGENCIES</u> For Village-centric emergencies during Village Office hours, contact the Deputy Clerk at (734) 222-5209. After hours, call the Village's on-call line at (734) 263-7020.

What is a "Village-centric emergency"? Examples include water main breaks, road obstructions, or noise violations of our Village ordinances. If there is a downed power line, first contact DTE at (800) 477-4747. Only after you've notified DTE should you then contact the Village so our staff can put up safety barriers until the DTE team arrives.

<u>SPRING IS HERE!</u> We know when Spring has sprung because the landscapers arrive in our beautiful Village. Landscapers can use power equipment (such as leaf blowers and bobcats) between <u>8AM-6PM</u>; homeowners can personally use such equipment from <u>8AM-10PM</u>. We thank you for respecting these hours so all of us can enjoy peaceful Spring evenings.

And, please remember that any detritus created by your gardeners/landscapers needs to be removed by them. Lawn detritus created by homeowners will be removed by Village staff - please refer to the <u>Resident Guidebook</u> for specific guidelines.

TRY A NATIVE PLANT OR TWO IN YOUR GARDEN... Native plants have deep, "thirsty" roots that help retain water on your site and filter out the pollutants in runoff. They help stabilize soils and prevent erosion. Try just one in your garden this summer!

- For shady areas -- wild geranium is a great choice -- nice flower, foliage stays around all year, pretty fall color.
- For sunnier spots -- penstemon digitalis (beardstongue) in well-draining soil -- it is relatively short, has a good season of bloom time in early summer, and keeps its foliage. OR swamp milkweed for wetter gardens areas -- fairly tall so not usually a 'front of the border' plant. For more information and native plant resources, go to www.hrwc.org
